# Letter from our newly appointed Rector

#### Dear Friends

I write to introduce myself. I was born at an early age and brought up in Brynmawr (which is the highest town in Wales). Growing up, as well as the obligatory odd paper round, I worked on a fruit and veg stall on the market. I went to school at St Mary's church school and Brynmawr Comprehensive school. I went to Christ Church College Canterbury where I met Mary my wife to whom I've been married for 38 years. My theological training was at St Michael's College in Llandaff which was combined with a Theology degree at University College Cardiff.

We moved to Swansea where I did two Curacies before moving to Knighton in Mid-Wales as Vicar of Knighton and Norton and subsequently priest in charge of Whitton, Pilleth and Cascob. Another move saw us going back to Swansea where I was Vicar of Killay for 15 years. During that time, I was also Director of Communications for the Diocese of Swansea and Brecon and Chair of Governors of an outstanding 2000 pupil Secondary School. I have been involved in schools work for the whole of my ministry both in governance and pastorally and latterly have been the director of one of the local academies.

Mary and I have two grown up boys and two beautiful grandchildren, and one slightly bonkers aging labradoodle. As for my leisure time, I like watching rugby, I enjoy a real ale and love to cook. Recently I have discovered water colour painting. I have been known to tread the boards from Panto to Plays and we enjoy going to the theatre and live music events.

As I step into this new role as your Rector, I am filled with anticipation and excitement for the journey we're about to embark on together, for the new adventure which awaits us. As I write this, I find myself reflecting on the sense of anticipation that fills the Advent season. Just as we await the coming of Christ at Christmas, we too await a new chapter for these parishes - a time to renew our faith, deepen our community, and embrace the mission before us.

The Christmas story itself is one of bold beginnings, of trusting God's direction amid the unknown. Mary and Joseph set out on a journey of faith that forever changed the world, relying not on certainty, but on that faith and hope. Their path reminds us that God is with us in every new beginning, in every unfamiliar step. Whilst I wouldn't presume to say that Mary and Tim setting out on this journey will be world changing, as we walk this journey together, I am filled with that same hope: that through our trust, love, and unity, God will guide and transform us.

This Advent and Christmas, let us be open to the Spirit's movement, ready to be surprised by the newness God can bring. There is a unique energy in joining a community with its own history, traditions, and spirit, and I am privileged to become a part of it. I look forward to getting to know each of you better, discovering the gifts and strengths we bring as a parish, and discerning how God is calling us forward together.

This is a new season not only for me but for all of us, and I'm excited to explore the ways we can grow in faith, deepen our connections, and reach out to those around us. I trust that as we share in worship, ministry, and fellowship, we'll find renewed purpose and joy in what God is calling us to do.

Mary and I are truly looking forward to what lies ahead as we seek God's guidance in our lives and in the world. Just as Christ entered the world, so God's light enters our lives, filling us with resolve and grace for the adventure ahead.

There will be a prize for the best costume worn by a child under 16 at each performance from Thursday 23rd to Sunday 26th January.



# Ombersley Gardening Club



We go headlong from Autumn into Winter, with darker evenings and colder days and nights and now is the time to prepare and protect our plants from the frost, gales and freezing snow.

During early December and the last few days of November there is still time to plant bulbs and bare root trees for stunning growth in the warmer months. Improve soil with mulching and compost especially around roses and hydrangeas for wonderful blooms next year. Plant up window boxes and pots with daffodils and tulips for a beautiful display in the Spring. Prune fruit trees and cut back perennials and clear up dead leaves.

If your garden is looking a little dull as winter approaches and the autumn colours are fading along with the disappearing flowers and berries, then add a little colour with some winter plants such as winter iris, snowdrops, hellebores and early flowering clematis. Wildlife may need to depend on you so keep bird feeders topped up and fresh water around.

During December some members look forward to a craft evening making a Christmas decoration at a willow making class followed on the **12<sup>th</sup> December** by the members Christmas dinner which is always a tremendous evening.

The clubs programme for speakers and visits in 2025 starts on Thursday **January 16**<sup>th</sup> with John Tilt talking to us on Grafton Wood and Butterfly Conservation and we hope later in the month to have a snowdrop visit.

All that is left now is for your gardening club committee to wish you all a truly Wonderful Christmas and a very Happy and Healthy 2025.

We look forward to welcoming members next year and if you haven't visited your local gardening club yet, then pop along and see what you think. New members are always welcome.

## **Ombersley and Doverdale Parish Council**

As we approach the end of 2024, and look forward to the year ahead, I would like to take the opportunity to reflect on all that's been achieved by members of your Parish Council – all of whom give their time and energy voluntarily in helping to maintain and improve the Parish in which you live.

This year has seen the completion of the renovation of the Weighbridge Hut, which going forward, will be known as "The Weighbridge Office". Once an integral part of the day-to-day life of the village, it is hoped the sympathetic renovations will stand the test of time for future generations and will, once more, become a much loved and valued asset to the village, providing a meeting point for local organisations.

Traffic in Ombersley: One of the major issues highlighted during the resident survey was the speed and volumes of traffic through the village. With the assistance from Worcestershire highways and support from our county councillor in 2023, the Parish Council initiated a planned programme of traffic calming measures; this included road marking, village gateway and the installation of four Vehicle Activated Signs (VAS) on the entry and exit points of the village.

During 2024 further traffic calming measures have been implemented, and a new gateway and signage have been installed on the A4133 opposite Ombersley school. The flashing school warning signs will shortly be replaced with a smart system. A new VAS unit has been installed on the A4133 by the Spar convenience store, with a second VAS unit funded and sited by Holt Parish Council on the other side of the River Severn towards Broomfield's shop. Recent data downloaded from VAS units indicate that traffic volumes continue to increase. A more detailed summary of the data will be given in the next edition of the parish magazine.

With the Parish being such a desirable area to live in, it's no coincidence planning applications play a significant part in life of the Council, with each application reviewed by the Councillors as they are received. Although we are not able to liaise directly with applicants, it's worth keeping an eye on our website <a href="www.odpc.co.uk/planning">www.odpc.co.uk/planning</a> for weekly updates of applications and notices received, which you can also find on the Parish noticeboards.

And the same is true for road and footpath closures, all of which you will find listed on our website under 'Notices.' Going forward, we will be looking at ways to streamline the sharing of information as it is received across our social media platforms – keeping you up to date with information as you need it.

Both new and refurbished litter and dog fouling bins have been ordered to further enhance the village and help in the efforts to minimise unsightly litter. If you do spot

an overflowing bin in the Parish it's worth reporting to www.wychavon.gov.uk under 'Report litter or dog bin not emptied'.

And finally, following requests from village youngsters, the table tennis table (located on the Memorial Hall field by the play area) was successfully installed just in time for October half term for all to enjoy. We look forward to publishing league results in the coming months. Another notable example of Councillors listening and responding to community requests for the benefit of all.





# Narnia, Lord of The Rings and Worcestershire



Well may you ask, what do the three have in common? Clive Staples Lewis, the author of The Chronicles of Narnia books, was sent from Ireland to a preparatory school in Malvern because it was thought the superior air quality and health-giving benefits of the Malvern Hills would help his chest problems. In September 1913, aged 14, he attended Malvern College. Whilst in Malvern he spent many hours hiking around the hills.

Local legend has it that one snowy night whilst walking in Malvern he noticed the Victorian gas lamps which lined the streets. He remarked "that would make a very nice opening line to a book". Hence the scene described in the opening description of Narnia in The Lion, The Witch and The Wardrobe.

1916 saw Lewis in Oxford as a student where he met his lifelong friend John Ronald Reuel Tolkein – later to be the author of The Hobbit and Lord of the Rings. They were integral members of the informal literary group, based in Oxford, known as "The Inklings". Together, in the 1930s, they spent many hours wandering around the Malvern Hills, which Lewis had loved since his school days.

Tolkein, born in South Africa, came to be educated at King Edwards School, Edgbaston, (a very fine school!) when his father died. The family lived at Sarehole, in what is now Hall Green, but was then a Worcestershire village. Sarehole Mill, Moseley Bog and the Clent, Lickey and Malvern Hills were a source of inspiration for his high fantasy books. None, perhaps, were a greater inspiration than his aunt's farm in Dormston, Worcestershire, named "Bag End".

So, two of the greatest writers of the 20<sup>th</sup> century owe Worcestershire for their inspiration for some of the finest imaginative stories of the 20<sup>th</sup> century - but, which is Worcestershire Mordor or Narnia?
